Child Martyrs in Russia

Among the most heart-rending scenes in the tragedy of post-war Russia is that of the millions of starving children, abandoned by their parents, regarded by Bolshevist society as outcasts, and left to live by crime or die of disease. The causes of this national disaster, the descriptions of child life in several parts of Russia, and the responsibility of the Soviet Government are dealt with in an unbiased work by Vladimir Zanzinov, who quotes largely from the Soviet press for his authority.

At times, since the revolution, it is estimated that the number of deserted children in Russia has reached to six or seven millions. These millions of children have had to seek refuge in the streets of the Russian cities. The author tells how they take shelter in the catacombs or sleep huddled together in the cauldrons which during the day time are used for preparing asphalt. Some gain a night's rest by standing up concealed behind cupboards in the railway stations, others crowd into some ruined cellar which the rest of the world has forgotten. The temperature is many degrees below freezing point and all the children have to cover them are rags. No tongue can describe their misery.

Driven wild by despair, the children organize themselves into gangs. They live by begging, stealing and prostitution. "Mixing with all the outcasts of society, they are quickly corrupted by the scenes they witness: drinking bouts, gambling, thefts and debauches of all kinds." A Kharkov doctor's report is guoted, indicating increase of infantile prostitution: The Committee of Help for Children, which has reported on a thousand girls from eight to sixteen, stated that 800 of them were no longer virgins and 300 had already taken venereal infection." The author ends with a chapter entitled "Bluff," quoting numerous statements made by naive Englishmen, who have been on conducted tours in Soviet Russia

As he is quite young we thought it better to wait a little while. On our recent trip this lad came over the mountains and was baptized. His mother witnessed her son's open confession to his Saviour and made no opposition. It is thus the mighty Lord works in those dear hearts.

A sister had two tumors in her bowels: by aid of X-rays they were located. The Lord, in mercy heard our cry and healed her completely. She is happy and is praising the Lord.

We are waiting for Jesus, our Lord, from heaven. May we all be ready at His appearing.

The Solution of the Unemployment Situation

When I first thought of coming to Bible School, I had no means to come. I wanted to come very much and felt the pull of the Spirit toward coming. I had no work by which to earn money. So a few of us got together and prayed, believing that God would answer our prayer.

Soon we got word that a man living in the Lake Road wanted berry pickers. We applied and soon had a job earning four cents a quart. At

most places pickers were getting two and a half cents a quart. We were able to earn about two dollars a day, each. We earned quite a sum of money there. One morning this farmer phoned us that he did not need pickers any longer. Being unemployed, we prayed again.

A few hours later that same day, we heard of another place and phoned to ask if they needed more berry pickers. They said they did. We went to the place the next morning. The lady we worked for was very kind: when we would bring in five quarts of berries, she would punch our tickets for six. During berry season, my mother and sister and I earned fifty-five dollars.

When berries were over, there was no job in sight for any of us. Again we prayed earnestly, and soon my mother got work in the canning factory and my sister got a job in the basket factory, while I stayed at home and kept house. Just before the grape picking season started, both factories shut down. Again we prayed for work, but the clouds of prospect looked dark. However, one morning a farmer came to the house and asked us if we were picking grapes anywhere. We told him we were not. He said he wanted us at noon. When he gave mother the pay it was twenty dollars. He had advanced her seven dollars, because he knew I was going to Bible School.

The Lord opened the way for me to come to Bible School and here I am. Praise His Holy Name. Prayer changes things.

xii, we quote as follows: The word pneumatika lit. "spirituals" i. e. matters of or from the Holy Spirit, gives the key to chapters 12, 13, 14, "To each believer is given a spiritual enablement and capacity for specific service. No believer is destitute of such gift . . . The gifts are diverse, but all are equally honorable, because bestowed by the same Spirit, administered under the same Lord, and energised by the same God." Again these notes are very befogging and misleading. We ask, where are spiritual gifts to be found amongst the Fundamentalists or so-called Plymouth Brethren, or amongst any of the denominational churches? In Pentecostal assemblies, in particular instances some of the prophetic gifts are exercized by baptized believers; but we have yet to learn, in these United States, of any accredited prophetic utterance or spiritual gifts in evidence in any of the denominational churches, or other bodies of evangelical Christians.

In Rev. xii, the woman, mentioned in verse one, is interpreted by Mr. Schofield to be Israel and the manchild, in verse 5, to be Christ.
